### Body text

In the body of the text quotations are in English translation (by author of volume or specified by ‘tr. translator’). Footnote, with original Greek and edition references (e.g. Procl. *Inst.* 20 Dodds)

Quoting Ancient/Byzantine authors with abbreviations:

Abbreviations to be used in this order:

1) Liddle Scott

2) Lampe *Patristic dictionary*

3) appendix of the present style guide (for specific questions write to Sarah or Frederick)

Examples: Procl. *Theol. Plat.* IV.31.24-25 Saffrey Westerink

Titles of volumes in body text: titles always in *italics*

Always employ abbreviation system based on Liddle/Lampe

Always include the surname of the editor at the end of references
